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Dear Parents / Carers

I hope this correspondence finds you well.

Post half term I would like to take this opportunity to share some information linked to upcoming opportunities and events.

### Students working from home on Wednesday 1st March

I would just like to take this opportunity to say well done to all the Year 7s for managing their time at home positively this past Wednesday. My message to all students has been giving their best efforts is all that is required on these days and any challenges of difficulties can be addressed with specific teachers in upcoming lessons. Further information re the proposed strike action on 15 & 16 March will follow in Mr Lowdell's letter next Friday.

### Whitemoor Lakes Trip

Our first residential trip as a year group is fast approaching on 21st-23rd April and preparations are well underway for what should be a fantastic experience for all of the students involved. We will be completing activity grouping and sleeping arrangements over the coming weeks in school and final details for the arrangements of the trip will be available via a Parent/Carer information Evening on Tuesday 18th April 2023 from 6 to 7pm in school. Please come into school via the main reception on the evening of the event and the presentation will take place in the main school theatre. In advance of this event can I also please draw your attention to a 'kit list' shared by the activity centre to ensure students are fully prepared for the weekend.

### Ski Trip 2024

This term, we are to launch the Ski Trip 2024 – on the back of the very successful and over-subscribed 2023 trip, you can read about the 2023 trip and view some photographs on our website [here](#)

The intended date is the first week of Easter holidays 2024 – from Friday 22nd to Saturday 30th March. The total cost of the trip is provisionally £1150 – expensive out of context but very good value for money for a full-board trip. We can only offer limited spaces (capped at 42) and, while probably unlikely, we hope everyone who wants a space secures one.

There will be a specific process for the allocation of places on this potentially very popular trip:

- On Ski Trip 2024 Launch Day (**Friday, 17th March**), ParentPay will be open for all parents of students in Y7-12 to pay a deposit of £250 and effectively apply for a place
- ParentPay will remain open from the Launch Day on that Friday until the following Wednesday

- If there are 42 or fewer students who have been signed up by that Wednesday, all those who have signed up will be allocated the places they have applied for and all 42 spaces will be allocated on a first come-first served basis
- If more than 42 students have applied by the Wednesday, priority will be given to students who did NOT go on the 2023 Trip
- If more than 42 students who did NOT go on the 2023 Trip have applied by the Wednesday, the 42 places allocated will be based on which of them signed up first – ParentPay records the signing-up time
- Any spaces allocated to those who went on the 2023 trip will be done so on the basis of first come-first served as recorded in ParentPay

This is to try to ensure that there has been a reasonable opportunity for students who did not access the 2023 trip to be able to go on the 2024 trip. Whether or not a space on the trip has been secured will be confirmed via email contact. Any monies paid on ParentPay by parents who apply but do not ultimately secure a place for their child will of course be refunded.

Please bear all this in mind when applying for a place as we want to manage expectations as best we can and not disappoint students – i.e. please await a confirmation email before telling your child they have a place. We are hopeful parents understand the reasoning for this.

#### Safeline Workshops

We wanted to make you aware of 3 parent workshops being provided by Safeline. Safeline work with groups of vulnerable children, but they also want to support parents with updates on what children are potentially being exposed to as well as providing an insight to many important topics that arise within society today. This service is free, and the workshops are on Zoom so parents don't have to worry about childcare.

These workshops will take place once a week on **Monday 6<sup>th</sup> March 2023, Monday 13<sup>th</sup> March 2023 and Monday 20<sup>th</sup> March 2023**. These sessions will always begin at **5:00pm and end at 6:00pm**.

The first session is based on Internet Safety which includes the following outcomes: Providing knowledge around social media apps/privacy settings, knowledge around online grooming - the risks and dangers, a deeper understanding of Cyberbullying and how to respond to it and understanding the risks behind Online Gaming.

The second session will be about Mental Health and Welfare issues, which will provide an understanding of what Mental Health is, allow you to gain a better knowledge of what can affect

children's mental health, how to best support children if they are suffering with Mental Health Issues and any useful apps/websites for external support.

The final session will be based on Bullying and Sexual Harassment in Schools. This session discusses how to recognise the signs of bullying/sexual harassment, how to support your young person through it and how to report it.
